

ITALIAN (ITAL)

(Department of Romance Languages)

Italian 111 (4)—Elementary Italian I

Limited enrollment. A course in elementary Italian which emphasizes grammar and the skills of speaking, writing, reading and listening comprehension. *Staff.*

Fall

Italian 111S (4)—Elementary Italian I at John Cabot University

Required for students without Italian language background. A course in elementary Italian which emphasizes grammar and the skills of speaking, writing, reading and listening comprehension, with special emphasis on conversational practice in context. *Youngblood.*

Fall, Winter

Italian 112 (4)—Elementary Italian II

Prerequisites: Departmental permission and either Italian 111 or the equivalent in language skills. Limited enrollment. A course in elementary Italian which emphasizes grammar and the skills of speaking, writing, reading and listening comprehension. *Staff.*

Winter

Italian 161 (3)—Intermediate Italian I

Prerequisites: Departmental permission and either Italian 112 or the equivalent in language skills. With some attention paid to review of the major elements of Italian grammar and phonetics, this course addresses the development of the first stage of intermediate communicative Italian vocabulary and develops active intermediate competence in the language. The traditional skills of foreign language instruction (structure, listening comprehension, reading, writing and speaking) are stressed. *Staff.*

Fall

Italian 162 (3)—Intermediate Italian II

Prerequisites: Departmental permission and either Italian 161 or the equivalent in language skills. Continuation and development of the level of knowledge and competence attained in Italian 161. Increase of grammar mastery, vocabulary development, level of reading, writing, and listening comprehension, as often as possible with the use of film, virtual museum material on the Internet, and online newspaper articles. Attainment of the commensurate level of oral Italian is stressed. (FL, GE2) *Staff.*

Winter

Italian 202 (6 or 3-3)—Supervised Study Abroad

Prerequisites: Italian 162, permission of the instructor and approval of the International Education Committee. Credits may be split between Italian and other disciplines with approval of the departments involved. A total immersion Italian language and culture course in Northern Italy (classes at and cotaught by faculty members in the Italian and other departments of the Universities of Padua and Genoa) with excursions to the nearby cities of major cultural importance. A required Winter-Term cultural preparation and training period precedes residence in Padua and Genoa. Additional details are available from the director of the program. *Staff.*

Spring

Italian 401 (1), 402 (2)—Directed Individual Study

Prerequisite: Permission of the instructor. Advanced study in Italian. The nature and content of the course will be determined by the students' needs and by an evaluation of their previous work. May be repeated for degree credit with permission and if the topics are different. *Staff.*

Offered when interest is expressed and departmental resources permit.

Italian 403 (3)—Directed Individual Study

Prerequisite: Permission of the instructor. Advanced study in Italian. The nature and content of the course is determined by the students' needs and by an evaluation of their previous work. May be repeated for degree credit with permission and if the topics are different. (GE3: only when the subject is literary.)

Offered when interest is expressed and departmental resources permit.
