**1) English Composition** (check one box)

- proficient when entering W&L  
 one of the following courses: English 101,105

**2) Foreign Language** (check one box)

- proficient (qualified to enter a third year course) when entering W&L  
 one of the following courses: Chinese 262; French 162, 164; German 262; Greek 202; Italian 162; Japanese 262; Latin 202; Russian 262; or Spanish 162, 164

**3) Literature** - two courses (six credits) from the following:

- a) Chinese 312 and 400-level courses if the subject matter is literary  
b) Classics 201,203,204,300 (History 300, if not used for GE4)  
c) English - all 200- and 300-level courses *except* English 201,203,204,301,303,307,308,370,385,386  
d) French 273,331,332,341,342,343,344,397  
e) German - all 300-level courses *except* German 301,302,303,311,312,321(unless literary),325,332  
f) Greek - all 300-level courses  
g) Italian - 400-level courses if the subject matter is literary  
h) Japanese 311,312 and 400-level courses if the subject matter is literary  
i) Latin - all 300-level courses  
j) Literature in Translation - all courses  
k) Religion 272  
l) Russian 315,316  
m) Spanish 207,208 and all 300-level courses

**4) Fine Arts, History, Philosophy, Religion** - at least 12 credits, which may include Interdepartmental 101, and must include courses from at least two of the following four areas area/credits

- \_\_\_\_\_ a) Fine Arts - Classics 200,287,288; Medieval and Renaissance Studies 110; all art below 400-level *except* Art 395; all music below 400-level *except* Music 101,108 to 117,361,362 and the applied music courses; all theatre below 400-level *except* Theatre 142,242,397  
 \_\_\_\_\_ b) History - Classics 300 (if not used for GE3); all courses below 400-level *except* History 190  
 \_\_\_\_\_ c) Philosophy - Classics 221; Greek 302; all philosophy below 400-level *except* Philosophy 305  
 \_\_\_\_\_ d) Religion - Sociology 221,315; all religion below 400-level *except* Religion 200,272

**5) Science and Mathematics** - at least ten credits, including four credits from **a.** and one course from **b.**

- a) Four credits laboratory science from Biology 111,112; Chemistry 100,106,110,111; Geology 100,101; Physics 101 and 103, 111 and 113, 112 and 114, 150,151  
 b) One course chosen from Computer Science 101,111; Mathematics 101,121  
 c) Three credits additional mathematics or science from any of the above not used or from Biology 101,230,231,235,240,246; Chemistry 112,195; Computer Science 112; Engineering 160; Geology 102,104,108,135,140,141,146,150,160,195,201,247; Mathematics 102,118,122,195; Physics 104,110

**6) Social Science** - at least nine credits which may include Interdepartmental 110, and must include courses from at least two of the following four areas area/credits

**7) Physical Education** - completion of a swimming test and five skills courses chosen from Physical Education 101-215
