

GE1) English Composition (check one box)

- proficient when entering W&L
 one of the following courses: English 101,105

GE2) Foreign Language (check one box)

- proficient (qualified to enter a third year course) when entering W&L
 one of the following courses: Chinese 262; French 162 or 172; German 262 or 263; Greek 202; Italian 162; Japanese 262; Latin 202; Russian 262 or 263; or Spanish 162 or 164

GE3) Literature - two courses (six credits) from the following:
