

GE1) English Composition (check one box)

- proficient when entering W&L
 one of the following courses: English 101,105

GE2) Foreign Language (check one box)

- proficient (qualified to enter a third year course) when entering W&L
 one of the following courses: Chinese 262; French 162 or 172; German 262 or 263; Greek 202; Italian 162 or 163; Japanese 262; Latin 202; Portuguese 163; Russian 262 or 263; or Spanish 162 or 164

GE3) Literature - two courses (six credits) from the following:

 b) One course chosen from Computer Science 101,111,121; Mathematics 101,121
 c) Three credits additional mathematics or science from any of the above not used or from Biology 101,231,235,240,240S,246; Chemistry 112,133,155,195,196; Computer Science 102,112,196,250; Engineering 101,160; Geology 104,141,144,150,155,195,197,205,247; Mathematics 102,118,122,171,195; Physics 115
